Public Notice: Fish Habitat Studies

Schedule window: Summer - Fall

What We're Doing:

The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) will perform fish habitat studies. These studies will collect data on fish habitat, fish species presence, critical spawning areas, and water quality. Fish presence survey methods include fish traps, electro-fishing (the use of direct current electricity to stun, but not harm, nearby fish), angling, and visual survey by helicopter. All captured fish will be identified, measured, and released. ADF&G performed studies in 2021 between Project mileposts 0 and 58; additional sampling will target sites between MP 58 and 211. The data will influence the design parameters for culvert and bridge crossings, protect sensitive areas, and clarify potential permitting requirements.
